1 Brief summary of the discipline

The programme of study of the discipline "Medical Law" is intended for higher medical educational institutions of Ukraine in accordance with the requirements of the ECTS credit transfer system of educational process organisation, based on a combination of teaching technologies by sections and credit assessment credits - units of measurement of the student's workload required for mastering the discipline or its section.

2 Prerequisite for the course

For successful mastering of the discipline, a higher education applicant needs knowledge gained in the process of studying the following general training disciplines: "Latin language and medical terminology", "Labour protection in the industry", "Social medicine and public health", "Hygiene and occupational diseases, health care organisation". The main provisions of the discipline can be applied in the study of professional training disciplines, which involves the integration of teaching with these disciplines and the application of the acquired knowledge, skills and abilities in the process of further education and professional activities.

3 Purpose and objectives of the discipline

The purpose of teaching the discipline "Medical Law" is:

- formation and development of future specialists' competence in the field of medical law, aimed at obtaining the necessary amount of theoretical medical and legal knowledge, acquiring practical skills in the field of health care;
- mastering a sufficient level of legal culture and legal consciousness to maintain a balance of relations between the subjects of medical legal relations and observance of human rights in the field of health care.

The main objectives of the discipline "Medical Law" are

- to familiarise students with international legal standards in the field of human rights and healthcare;
- to reveal the national legislative support of the healthcare sector, including the provision of medical care;
- to highlight the legal status of subjects of medical legal relations, as well as forms, methods and means of protecting their rights;
- to describe the types of legal liability for professional offences in the healthcare sector.

4 Learning outcomes

PLR-1	Have a thorough knowledge of the structure of professional activity. Be able to carry out professional activities that require updating and integrating knowledge. To be responsible for professional development, the ability to further professional training with a high level of autonomy.

Evaluation system and requirements

Current control is based on the control of theoretical knowledge, practical skills and abilities.

The forms of current control are: oral questioning (frontal, individual, combined), interview; practical testing of the formed professional skills (conducted based on the results of practical work at the end of the class); test control ("open" and "closed" test tasks). Current control is mandatory. When assessing the mastery of each topic in all disciplines of the curriculum, students are given grades on a 4-point (traditional) scale for current learning activities, taking into account the approved assessment criteria for the discipline. All types of work provided by the curriculum are taken into account. The student must receive a grade for each topic. The teacher conducts a survey of each student in the group at each lesson and gives a grade in the student's attendance and progress record on a traditional scale ("5", "4", "3", "2").

When assessing a student's current learning activities, 20% of the grade is based on the student's independent work, which takes into account the knowledge of the topic of the independent lesson and the work in the notebook.

The final (summative) control of the sections is carried out at the end of the section in the form of a written test, theoretical questions and control of practical skills.

Such control methods as oral, written and test are used, which should help to increase the motivation of students-future professionals to educational and cognitive activities. In accordance with the specifics of professional training, preference is given to test and written control. In the final control, preference is given to written or test control.

Conditions for admission to the final control

The maximum number of points for a discipline is 200 points. The ratio between the results of the assessment of current learning activities and the final control of knowledge is 60% and 40%.

The study of the discipline ends with a test.

The maximum number of points that a student can gain for the current learning activity in the course of studying the discipline is 200 points, the minimum number of points - the minimum number of points - is 120 points.

The number of points is calculated on the basis of the grades received by the student on a 4-point (national) scale during the study of the discipline, by calculating the arithmetic mean, rounded to two decimal places.

The student receives a credit at the last class in the discipline based on the results of the current assessment. Only those students who have no academic debt and whose average grade for the current academic activity in the discipline is at least 3.00.

Discipline policy

A prerequisite for a successful educational process is personal compliance by each student of a higher education institution with the rules of conduct accepted both at the university and in society. The future doctor must have a high level of behavioural culture, behave with dignity, tact, and self-control.

The student must be on time for classes and wear academic medical uniform (white coat or surgical suit). The student must adhere to the schedule of the educational process, come to class prepared on the topic of the class. During the class, the student must not leave the classroom without the permission of the teacher; use a mobile phone and other means of communication and information without the permission of the teacher, engage in outside activities, distract other students. When writing different types of papers, students must adhere to the rules of academic integrity.

The teacher must adhere to the implementation of the curriculum, objectively assess students' knowledge and skills. During the educational process, the teacher must be aware of anti-corruption measures and not engage in corrupt activities.

Policy on absences and late assignments

A student who, for valid reasons, confirmed by documentary evidence, was not subject to current control has the right to pass the current control within two weeks after returning to study.

A student who was absent from classes without valid reasons, did not participate in the current control activities, did not eliminate academic debt, is not allowed to take the final semester control of knowledge in this discipline, and on the day of the exam, the academic staff member gives the grade "not admitted" in the examination record. Retaking the differentiated test in the discipline is assigned subject to the completion of all types of educational, independent (individual) work provided for in the working curriculum of the discipline and is carried out in accordance with the schedule of liquidation of academic debt approved by the directorate.
